## PW2PA Alliance commences

The Port Wakefield to Port Augusta Alliance (PW2PA), a consortium of CPB Contractors, Aurecon, GHD, in alliance with the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure has been awarded the contract to design and construct the Port Wakefield Overpass and Highway Duplication Project. Design works have been progressing since March 2020, when the Alliance was formed.

The \$124.5M Port Wakefield Overpass and Highway Duplication Project is a joint initiative of the Australian and South Australian Governments.

Port Wakefield Highway typically carries 8,800 vehicles per day, however, this can increase to around 16,000

during peak holiday periods. As a result of high holiday traffic volumes and conflicting traffic movements at the intersection with the Copper Coast Highway, lengthy queues have been experienced causing substantial delays. The Augusta Highway and Copper Coast Highway intersection north of Port Wakefield is one of the State's busiest regional road intersections being a national and regional link between Adelaide, Port Augusta and the Yorke Peninsula.

The project will improve traffic flow and reduce congestion for all road users, particularly during peak travel times and public holidays and improve safety and freight productivity along the National Land Transport Network.

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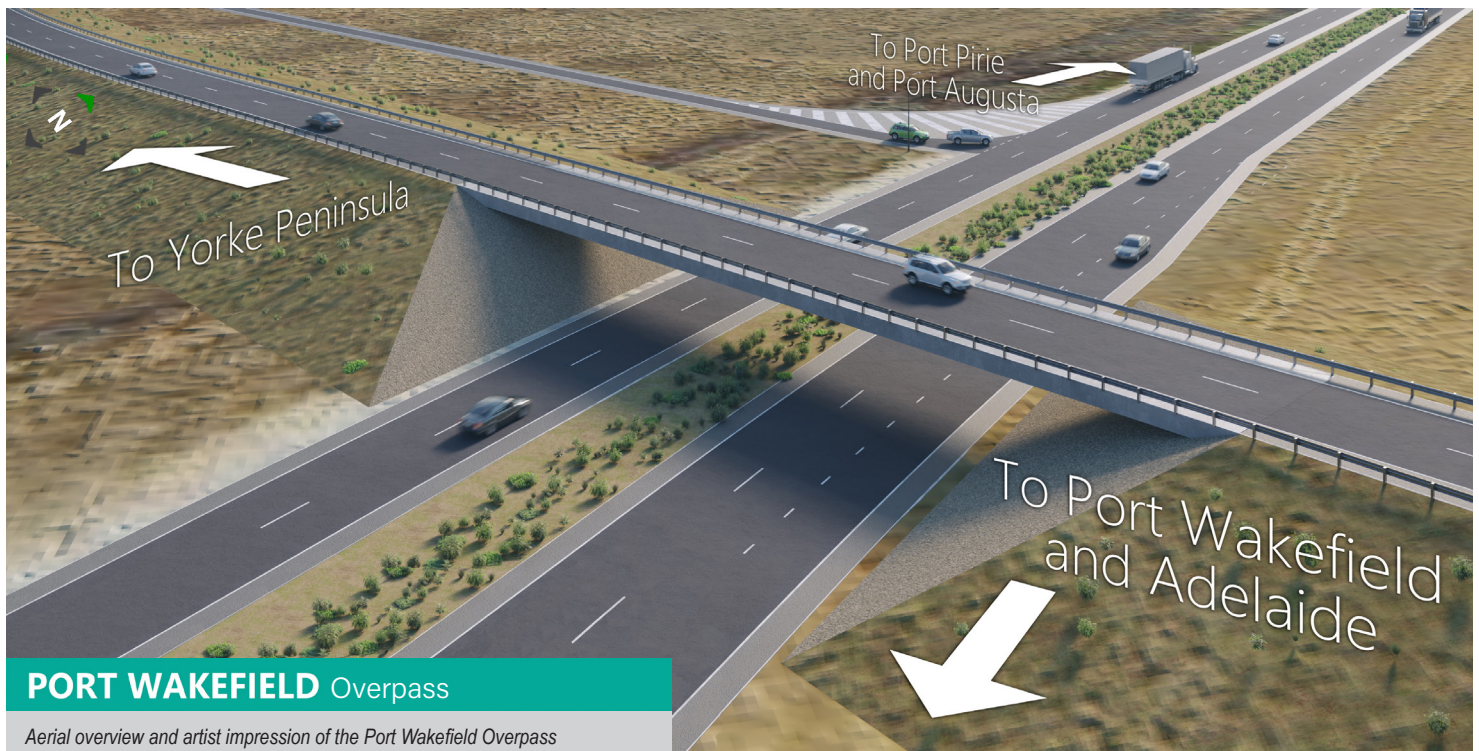


## Project Design

The works include:

- Two lanes in each direction through the Port Wakefield township with provisions for safe U-turn movements.
- A realigned dual carriageway through the Port Wakefield township, allowing for increased parking and landscaping opportunities, as well as safer vehicle and pedestrian movements. This will make it safer to build and reduce disruption to motorists during construction.
- A realigned Balaklava Road intersection with the Port Wakefield Highway, allowing for safer turn movements.
- New bridges across the Wakefield River.
- A new two-lane overpass for traffic travelling southbound from the Copper Coast Highway to Port Wakefield, and for traffic travelling along the Augusta Highway to the Copper Coast Highway; and the new overpass will remove all hazardous at-grade turn movements at the intersection of the Port Wakefield Highway, Copper Coast Highway and Augusta Highway.

As part of the urban design delivery of the project, the Alliance will collaborate with Aboriginal Groups, Wakefield Regional Council and key stakeholders in the design and implementation of cultural elements to strengthen local identity, community pride and interpretation of place.

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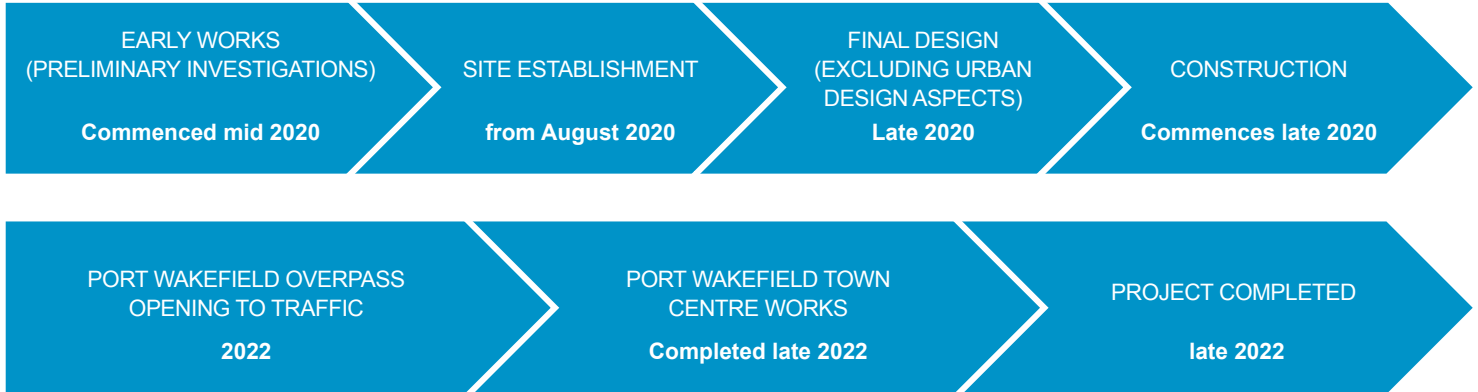


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## Key project milestone dates

## Site compound establishment and early works

From August 2020, the Alliance will establish a temporary site office at the former Tucker Time site on the Port Wakefield Highway, while the main site compound is being established just north of the BP Truckstop. The main site compound will consist of transportable office huts, a small amenities block and car parking for project staff.

Two smaller compounds with laydown areas will also be established:

- south of Port Wakefield on the Port Wakefield Highway; and
- just north of the Copper Coast Highway intersection with the Augusta Highway.

The project team will progressively move to site between August and October 2020.

In addition to setting up site offices, early works will include vegetation clearing and fencing works behind the service stations before construction of the new southbound lanes of the Port Wakefield Highway commence from late 2020. Traffic will remain on the existing highway and all traffic movements will be maintained while these works are undertaken. Speed restrictions will apply and road users are asked to use extra caution when workers are on site and observe traffic signage and speed restrictions when travelling through the area. Advance notice will be in place to alert road users.
